

# VETERINARY TECHNOLOGY



## OVERVIEW

Veterinary technicians (vet techs) are formally educated, licensed professionals who work under the supervision of veterinarians. Their duties include diagnostic imaging, dental care, nursing, surgical assistance, emergency and critical care, anesthesia and analgesia, client communication, office management, and medication administration. Vet techs assist in diagnosing and treating animal injuries, illnesses, and diseases, as well as providing routine wellness and preventive care. They care for a variety of species, including companion animals (dogs, cats), farm animals (horses, cattle, pigs, goats), exotics (birds, zoo animals), and laboratory animals (rodents, fish). Career paths include those within general practice, research, academia, specialty medicine, public health, government, zoological settings, and more.

## CREDENTIALS EARNED

Students who graduate in the Veterinary Technology Program will be eligible to sit for the national licensure exam (VTNE) and apply for state licensure.

## APPLICATION DATES:

Valley Campus classes are admitted once per year (fall semester). Application window is February - May for fall admission.

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

In addition to the general admission requirements of the College, application to the Veterinary Technology Program requires:

1. Attendance of an info session prior to acceptance.
2. Completion of prerequisite academic core courses with a minimum grade of "C" or higher meeting a 2.5 cumulative GPA.
3. 2.0 GPA at Southern Union if previously enrolled. Transfer students must enter the College on clear status.
4. Official transcripts in Records Office from all postsecondary institutions attended and high school transcript.
5. Optional - Official score on ACT National or ACT Residual with a minimum composite score of 18 (no time limit on when the test was taken) or bachelor's degree awarded.
6. Submission of complete application packet for Veterinary Technology Program during applicable submission dates only.

Meeting minimal requirements does not guarantee acceptance. **Notice:** admission requirements and procedures may change without prior notice. Please check with health sciences division and/or website for updates.
