

Southern Union State Community College Veterinary Technology Program Observation Form

Candidates wishing to enter into the admissions process for Southern Union's Veterinary Technology Program have the opportunity to earn up to an additional twelve (12) points toward application requirements. Each applicant wishing to earn credit for veterinary observation or work experience must have a currently licensed veterinarian or veterinary technician in good standing with the State veterinary medical board complete, verify and sign this document. Applicants must ensure this document is received and on file with Southern Union prior to the application deadline.

This document verifies that the student applicant has achieved observation or work-related experience in a veterinary setting (animal hospital, animal shelter, animal research facility etc.). The purpose of these observatory hours is to allow for an introduction to and exposure of the veterinary medical profession specifically as it relates to the veterinary technician's role. Ideally, prospective students would gain insight into the career they are choosing through this exposure to various veterinary procedures and related tasks such as medical, surgical, and clinical veterinary nursing care; client communication and interaction; animal husbandry and facility disinfection and cleaning; laboratory procedures (specimen collection, preparation and analysis); medical record keeping and clerical duties; anesthesia and analgesia; emergency care; and other forms of animal diagnosis, prognosis and treatment.
