



Southern Union is proud to have a chapter of Mu Alpha Theta, a mathematics honor society for high school and two-year college students. In addition to promoting interest in mathematics, the organization participates in community service projects. Mu Alpha Theta members have worked with the Jean Dean RIF (Reading is Fundamental) organization in Opelika to provide books for needy, at-risk children. They have also contributed money to the Lee County Habitat for Humanity and Camp Seale Harris for Diabetes; in addition to collecting needed products for the Tallapoosa County Sheriff's Girls Ranch and Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child Shoe Box Ministry. Mu Alpha Theta members assist with Southern Union's annual math tournament on the Wadley campus. The chapter also holds meetings once a month, where students enjoy fellowship and fun activities. To be eligible for membership, a student is required to take Precalculus Algebra (MTH 112) or higher, achieve a 3.5 GPA or above in all mathematics courses, and have an overall 3.0 GPA or higher. Students also have the option to transfer their membership if they were members in high school. Members have the opportunity to apply for national and chapter scholarships. Southern Union's chapter is honored to have students who have won scholarships at the national level.
